#### Where to find pirates

- LW: few examples
- MW: mainly 1,6 MHz, in some countries all band
- SW: 76/48 mb (usage of 43 mb in NA, SA, EU?)
- FM: 87.5-108 MHz, especially in metropols
- All possible fqs (even 860 MHz, TV or satellite!)
- Variation in different countries

#### Generally two types of stations


- 1) Broadcasting style stations
- do want to have listeners, long transmissions, ask for feedback, usually do confirm (QSL)
- 2) QSO stations
- do QSO with other operators, don't have long shows, music only for tuning in, don't have address for reports, but if you manage to find a way to contact they do confirm in many cases!

# Challenges in pirate hunting

- Listening is always fun, but if you like to count your results...
- Counting countries: the origin (even country) can be secret or totally unknown.. or just guess or opinion?
- Counting number of stations: usage of multiple names to hide origin or just confuse listeners...

Activities in 30-40 countries (today maybe 20-30)




#### The Netherlands

- Historically thousands of stations
- Today FM, MW mainly 1,6 MHz, SW, and other frequency ranges incl. LW
- International free radios on SW & 1,6 MHz with long shows and listener feedback
- Pure QSO stations on MW (1,6 MHz)
- Still today hundreds of stations, occasional raids

#### British and Irish isles

- FM (especially London / Essex): <u>Vibes FM</u>
- Otherwise mainly 48mb and nearby (and 76 mb) around 20-30 active stations on SW



#### Germany

- Mainly 48 mb and nearby
- (Trying to) hide
   QTH or act
   being Dutch
- Traditionally an active free radio country, still today many stations



#### Belgium and Baarle


- Few stations in Belgium (SW and MW)
- Some stations are said to be transmitting from Baarle, but is it worth of a country point?



#### Nordic countries

- Activity in all Scandinavian countries and in Finland: <u>Old Time Radio</u>
- No known activity in Iceland or other islands
- SW mainly 48mb, some stations do test also other SW bands. Very few stations on MW/FM.
- Around 20 active stations
- OZNRH studio recording

#### Southern Europe

- Sporadic examples from Iberian peninsula
- Few "broadcasting style" stations in France on SW, no known activity on MW. FM?
- Relatively much activity in Italy, mainly on 48 and 43 mb.
- Most active South European country is Greece
- There are (has been) stations which are said to be transmitting from Cyprus or Malta?

#### Southern Europe: Greece

- Most activity in North/North-Eastern Greece,
   Central Greece, and suburbs of Athens
- Not much activity on the islands
- Greece: Radio Devil, Thessaloniki 1621 kHz
- Mainly QSO stations on 1,6 MHz, very few stations "do imitate" broadcasting stations on MW band and short wave



#### Russia (incl. UKR, BLR, KAZ)

Russia rayons0-4, 6, 9

Ukraine rayon5

 All together hundreds of QSO stations, but very few broadcasting stations on



#### Russia (incl. UKR, BLR, KAZ)

- Russia: mainly QSO stations on 1,6 MHz, 3 MHz, around 6 and 10 MHz. Rare examples of longer music programmes which usually don't contain any kind of ID (Usually UNIDS)
- Audio: <u>Radio Planeta, Tambov</u>
- Ukraine: QSO stations + Evropa
- Kazakshtan: QSO stations?
- Belarus: <u>Integral, Minsk</u>



# Next goal a QSL from a QSO station?





#### Balkan

- Mainly in Serbia, and mainly around Belgrad
- 40-50 active stations
- Greetings from <u>Real Radio Mali Pozarevac</u>



## Central Europe (Austria)


Austria: only one station known so far:

- Traditional new years eve station: https://www.youtub e.com/watch?v=HY bNHa\_hC8Y




# Central Europe (Hungary)

- FM activity in Budapest




# Central Europe: Hungary



# Central Europe (Poland)

- Poland: relatively high FM activity in Southern Poland / Warsaw suburban areas.
- SW (48 mb)
   stations might be located in same area
- Young operators

#### Outside Europe

- Relatively much activity in USA
- Some stations also in Canada
- Latin American short wave stations in ARG, B, CHL, PRG. Different kind of pirates in PRU?
- Also some examples from past in AUS and NZL
- No known activity in Africa, neither the most of Asia
