Iran in numbers

- 90 million inhabitants
- Iran is 3,7 times larger than Sweden, or 4,6 times larger than Germany
- Teheran is capital with 16 million inhabitants
- Run by the shah up to 1979
- Islamic republic since the revolution in 1979
- President since July 2024 is reformist Masoud Pezeshkian






31 Iranian provinces – all with radio stations

- Most local stations have local identifications at xx.30 and specially around Iranian midnight (22.30 Scandinavian summer time)




Minority groups in Iran







Minority groups all over Iran

The modern Farsi/ Persian language

- Indo-European language family related to Latin, Greek, Slavic, and Germanic
- About half of Iran's population has Persian as their mother tongue
- In music, poetry, and art, Persians see themselves as the nation's leading force
- Persian dominates in Iran's major cities
- Persian is an ancient language developed through three historical periods
- Modern Persian dates from the year 900 influenced by Arabic in the region. Today, Persian is both a literary and everyday language.

Iranian exile radio and television

- Only focus here on official IRIB radio stations broadcasting from Iran
- No unofficial radio in Iran
- This is not part of the lecture:
- Radio Farda previous transmitting on MW and SW, future uncertain after closing down due to Trump decree
- Radio Iran International based in London, previous on SW





Radio and television in Iran

- IRIB Islamic Republic of Iran Broadcasting
- Monopoly on all broadcasts on radio and television in Iran
- According to itself, it is independent of the Iranian government
- Nevertheless the supreme leader of Iran, Ali Khamenei, is head of broadcasting – actually he is head of everything in Iran, including the religious establishment as well as politically

Radio and television in The Islamic Republic of Iran

- IRIB Radio Iran is the main national radio on mediumwave offering a wide range of services
- They include the main IRIB Radio Iran channel on 558 kHz transmitted nationwide from Teheran, part of provincial stations, IRIB World Service and special services during religious festivals and holiday
- More than 180 domestic and international radio-television channels
- English-spoken Press TV terrestrial in Iran, on satellite and internet

IRIB provincial stations on mediumwave



- Provincial stations all over Iran produce programmes in Farsi and dialects like Azeri, Kurdish and Gilaki
- Locally programmes usually during daytime 06.00-20.00 local time (02.30-16.30 UTC)
- Usually relay of nationwide programme at night, therefore many stations in parallel, but with local ID often at xx.30.
- Most provincial stations broadcasts a 90-minute programme "Shabhaya Iran" (which means "Iran Nights"), produces by each station in turn
- Often traditional Iranian music and reading of poems from famous poets like Rami, Ferdowsi, Khayam, Saadi and Hafez (illustrated left)



IRIB World Service

- IRIB World Service, also known as Pars Today, is the official broadcasting network of Iran
- It operates on several mediumwave frequencies for listeners in The Middle East, West Asia, Caucasus and Central Asia
- It has broadcasts in Arabic, Kurdish, Azeri, Turkish, Tajik, Dari (dialect of Farsi), Pashto and Turkmen
- It also has many broadcasts on shortwave with English twice a day a.o.










Radio stations for different subjects

- Radio Farhang (Radio Culture) broadcasts
 Islamic talk, education and information, and includes live broadcasts from parliament. It is on 585 kHz.
- Radio Quran broadcasts religious programmes, including Quran recitations and interpretations. It is on 900 kHz.
- Radio Ma'aref (Radio Education) broadcasts prayers and programmes on religion and ethics from studios in Qom. It is on 1071 kHz.
- Radio Payam (Radio Message) is based in Tehran and broadcasts news, talk and music. It is on 1188 kHz.
- All of them heard on medium wave in Denmark usually after sunset and around midnight Scandinavian time

- IRIB Radio Iran the oldest and most established radio station, started in 1940
- IRIB Radio Farhang culture and society


Iranian National Anthem

- Iranian National Anthem
- Often played around midnight local Iranian time (20.30 UTC)
- Played usually on almost all radio stations on Medium Wave
- More common is another anthem introduced after revolution



Identification of Iranian MW-stations

- Best listening time is midnight Iranian time (20.30 UTC)
- Three typical bell rings
- It is 24 midnight (bisto charhar)
- Here is Tabriz, provincial radio station, Eastern Azerbaijan.
- Anthem composed right after Islamic revolution in 1979 for radio and television. Mostly played at xx.00 local time
- Followed by news bulletin
- Detailed news at 14.00, 20.00, 22.00 and 24.00 local time



Help for identifikation

- When you listen in real time, find parallel listening on apps and webpages
- I usually use the following:
- IRIB websites (google it)
- Online Radio Box (both as web page and app – but seems that Iranian stations have disappeared from app)
- Google station name and find streaming online



- Inja (capital) ast. Sedaye Jomhuriye Islamiye Iran, shabakeye ostaniye (province)
- Usually after the ring bells and before revolutionary anthem, followed by news bulletin
- Left photo: Radio shop in downtown Teheran with a large variety of radios – also wellknown brands like Tecsun
- Iranians often watch BBC Farsi on hidden satellite dishes as it is forbidden by law






- 927 kHz a mix of Power 927 from Italy and IRIB Radio Lorestan (clear ID for 'bisto charhar' and 'Lorestan')
- Always listen for the bells and anthem






Typical ID from IRIB-stations (936 kHz Radio Chichest, Miandoab)




Arabic 1224 kHz (IRIB World Service, Kish)

- First heavy strong signal from Radio Rossii
- Audio stop, suddenly sign off by transmitter
- Clear ID from IRIB Radio Kordestan, Baneh in West Iran.
- Language is Kurdish, almost similar to Persian







Best time for listening to Iran


- Wintertime, early spring and late autumn
- Always after local sunset
- Midnight in Iran time difference is 1,5 hours from Scandinavian summertime (20.30 UTC)
- Extra broadcasts heard during holidays and Islamic religious holidays:
- Nowruz (new year): 20/3 2026
- Ramadan: 17/2-19/3 2026
- Muharram: 27/6-26/7 2025
- Ashoura: 5/7-6/7 2025

Recommended frequencies

- 585 kHz Radio Farhang
- 657 kHz Radio Gilan
- 837 kHz Radio Isfahan
- 936 kHz Radio Chichest
- 1026 kHz Radio Tabriz
- 1188 kHz Radio Payam
- 1512 kHz Radio Ardabil
